


- CEO of the Chicago & Northern IL Red Cross since 2016.
- Social worker at heart MSW from University of WI
- Fourth largest Red Cross region nationally, covering 21 counties and serving 9.5M people.
- Region responds to 1,400 local disasters annually with 3,000 local volunteers.
 Deploys hundreds of volunteers nationally.
- Annual budget of approximately \$16 million.
- Teaches more than 250K people in Chicagoland annually health, safety and disaster preparedness skills, including CPR and first aid.



Seven Major Relief Efforts in Five Months


Over 29,000 workers—over 90 percent volunteers—responded in five months to U.S. disaster events. We also supported the Mexican Red Cross earthquake response and provided Disaster Mental Health support at mass casualty events in Las Vegas, Texas and Florida.

In total in 2017, 56,000 disaster workers were mobilized to help after 242 significant disaster events.



volunteers respond to 3-4 home fires per day and other events such as flooding and microbursts, and many were deployed nationally.


